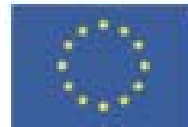

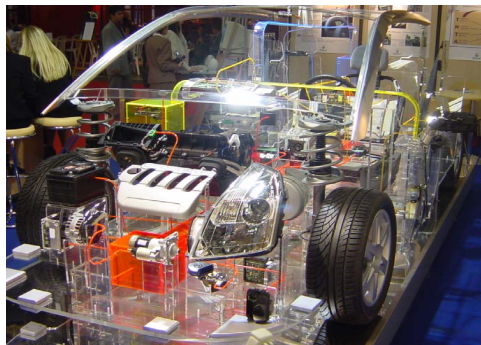

- Coordinated by ERTICO
- Duration: 24 Months
- Starting date: 1 January 2004



Approach

- Monitor and support the eSafety initiative and the implementation of its recommendations
- Platform for information collection and distribution
- Promote the networking of stakeholders

1. Monitor progress from the 28 eSafety priority recommendations and the eSafety Road Maps
2. Collect emerging results on eSafety priority topics (national & international)
3. Outreach – dissemination activities



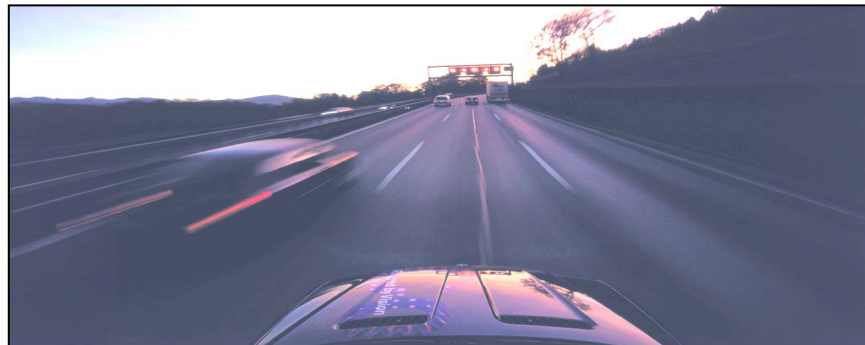

eSafety - making Europe's roads safer for everyone

Every year 40,000 people die on Europe's roads. During the last decade numerous measures were taken to reduce the number of fatalities on European roads. Nevertheless, from society's point of view the accident costs of road transport are too high with 1,300,000 accidents per year in Europe causing 40,000 fatalities and 1,700,000 injuries, at an estimated cost of 160 Billion €.

eSafety in a joint industry-public sectors initiative to improve road safety by using Intelligent Vehicle Safety Systems.

The objective is to join forces to build up a European strategy for accelerating the research and development, and the deployment of existing and new technologies.

What is eScope?

eScope is a European Commission funded project, which monitors, and encourages eSafety activities and serves as an easily accessible and up-to-date resource for information on priority eSafety topics.



The main activities of eScope:

1. Monitoring the progress of implementing the 28 eSafety priority recommendations and of the eSafety "Road Maps" to be agreed
2. Overview of European emerging results on eSafety priority topics
3. Awareness and dissemination



How?

eScope will closely follow the work of the eSafety Working Groups and assist in the outreach of findings from all eSafety activities. The dissemination of progress will be made through the eSafety Information platform on the website www.escope.info and through newsletters, and participation in eSafety events. eScope has appointed a group of "Advisers" who will assure that the project activities are in line with the needs of all involved eSafety stakeholders.

Furthermore, a list of eScope "Observers" from the European Member States will follow the project closely and give input on national eSafety activities.
