HLM with MS 18-O: Main Conclusions

The Member States:

- Supported **unanimously** the realisation of a pan-European in-vehicle emergency call service,
- Signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU): **Greece, Italy, Lithuania and Slovenia**, joining **Finland and Sweden**
- Announced that they had initiated the signature procedure: **Czech Republic, Cyprus, Denmark, The Netherlands and Germany;**

- **To be included for discussion and possible approval of conclusions under Austrian Presidency ?**
