Questionnaire results

- 17 Replies (14 members and 3 non members)
- Most replies from Europe, second from the US
- 95% Satisfied with the activities
- Only one mention that he will not participate in future meetings
- 14 agreed that it would be useful to organise targeted missions

- Support awareness campaigns for eSafety benefits targeting policy makers key stakeholders and end users
- Create legal conditions for early application
- Exchange of information - not only information from Europe
- Create political synergy
- Coordinated strategy for implementation
- Create common definition of the eSafety terminology
