What were the key objectives of the “old” ICWGW?

- Identify global best practice and lessons learned
- Cooperate on standardisation issues (ISO/TC22, ISO/TC204, CEN TC278 WG15)
- Create standards for certification, testing, benefit analysis
- Advice and encourage national applications of best practice
- Support awareness campaigns for eSafety benefits targeting policy makers key stakeholders and end users
- Create legal conditions for early application
- Exchange of information - not only information from Europe
- Create political synergy
- Coordinated strategy for implementation
- Create common definition of the eSafety terminology



The International Co-operation WG (2)

The “New” ICWG – Basic Principles

- A European Group – working under the premises and mandate of the eSafety Forum
- Membership from the eSafety Forum members, WG chairs and WG members
- Co-chaired by the European Commission and a expert on International Co-operation (e.g. UN/ECE)
- Separate from the political level which stays in the remit of the governments (EC, US DoT, Japan MLIT etc) who will continue bilateral meetings and co-ordination
- Other regions should establish similar groups, or discuss international co-operation as a part of the agenda of existing groups



The International Co-operation WG (3)

The “New” ICWG – Main tasks

- The Group identifies topics which need International Co-operation and proposes the necessary actions:
 - Recommendations to the political level
 - Recommendations for standardisation, further research etc
 - Fact-finding missions
- The Group can take responsibility for organising International Workshops, for example
 - The International Workshops on Vehicle Communications
- The Group can present the eSafety Forum at International Meetings, for example
 - Global eSafety Sessions at the ITS World Congresses
 - Meetings of the International Cooperation WGs
