## Review of Last Conference Call Summary (e-mail from Antonio Kung dated Jan 27, 2010)

## Discussion on the report

The report was reviewed (see slides for the detailed comments). Not all remarks from J.Scholten were discussed. This will be done at the next conference call (March 4<sup>th</sup>, 2010 1400 PM CET)

The modifications were listed (all actions assigned to Barbara, unless stated otherwise)

- Group motivation and content section in chapter 1
- Group recommendations in the conclusion section
- Revert to v0.9 concerning part 1. Prepare a list of comments to be submitted to the OEM (separating questions about clarity, and grammar/typos)
- Update legal section of part 2 (Action Bast)
- Add a statement on security of location oriented applications that will introduce new recommendation. Drop eCall as a use case (mention eCall as an example instead) (Action Antonio)
- Few remarks on Cooperative Section (see slides)
- Review recommendation resulting from part 1 (Action J.Scholten to provide a statement)

## Discussion on Recommendations

Further to the initial list of 4 recommendations, 3 others were identified :

- Separation of concern between independent based systems and interactive systems
- (new) Investigation on liability issues when applications beyond informing systems (e.g. with immediate impact on driving) are considered. Further research work are needed to understand and monitor those effects
- (new) Harmonisation of legal measures presently in place in member state concerning improvement of security (e.g. manipulation of mileage)
- (new) Specific security issues raised by specific applications (e.g. eCall) should be addressed (e.g. discussion, concertation, ...)
- Further discussion towards recommendations for privacy by design
- Validate some of the mechanisms in FOTs
- Further research e.g. on the issue of data fusion to improve confidence in the information

## Next Steps

- A version v0.94 will be provided by Barbara in Mid-March. Comments from the OEMS will be made to v0.94 by Mid-April. Subsequently the process of report finalisation will start (with possibly a meeting).
- A.Kung will present at the next eSafety steering committee (March 16<sup>th</sup>) the current state of work as well as the draft recommendation list.

## Remark

- The work related to data protection and relationship with the DPAs was not discussed (reminder : there will be a joint meeting on April 29<sup>th</sup>, 2010 in Brussels)
